



# Trainer Track Stats NH 'Summer Jumping' 2011

“Winner Finding Made Simple”

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## Introduction

First of all, congratulations and thank you for trying Trainer Track Stats NH 'Summer Jumping' 2011, the leading statistical analysis of racehorse trainer patterns. Over the past seven seasons, the trainers in this guide have all earned their place by consistently leading their horses into the winners' enclosure. But the key to this guide is that most of the trainers have a record that is negative overall. That is, if you'd simply bet all of their horses at the track, you'd have made a loss.

However, by carefully selecting specific types of race in which the trainer excels, Trainer Track Stats NH 2011 (TTS) provides a unique insight that is not available anywhere else. This further breakdown pinpoints with absolute precision the trainer specialities that you need to focus on. By only betting horses at 14/1 or shorter, TTS followers do miss the occasional big priced winner. But when putting this guide together, I decided that consistency of winners and shorter losing streaks is the route forward, and that's been borne out for our followers over the years.

However, do please note that due to the statistical nature of this information, losing runs can occur. I recommend a betting bank to begin with of at least 50 points. That is, if you normally bet £5, then a bank of £250 should be used. If you normally bet, £20, then £1000 bank is recommended, and so on.

## User's Guide

In putting this guide together, I have tried to make things as easy as possible. However, there are one or two terms which newcomers to jump racing may not understand, and so here is a glossary of terms and their meanings.

Term	Meaning
<b>All</b>	All runners for this trainer at this track
<b>Chase</b>	The larger of the obstacles in NH racing, usually for more mature horses
<b>Flat</b>	A beginner race for NH horses, involving racing without obstacles
<b>Hurdles/hdls</b>	Hurdles are the smaller of the two types of obstacles which NH racing features
<b>Hcap/hcp/handicap</b>	A Handicap is a race where horses carry weight according to their ability, such that each has a theoretically equal chance of winning
<b>Non-chase</b>	All races (i.e. flat and hurdles) except for chase races
<b>Non-flat</b>	All races (i.e. chases and hurdles) except for flat races
<b>Non-hurdles</b>	All races (i.e. flat and chase) except for hurdle races
<b>Yo</b>	'Year old', e.g. 3-7yo refers to horses aged between 3 and 7

*To find the TTS horses, simply check your newspaper daily for the relevant trainers and race types and, if there's a qualifier at 14/1 or shorter, it's a bet! It's as easy as that. But remember, we are only betting between July 1<sup>st</sup> and September 30<sup>th</sup>, which is considered the National Hunt Summer Jumps season.*

### A word on ★'s

★'s are awarded to any trainer who has achieved one or more of the following over the last seven years, with horses sent off at 14/1 or shorter, July to September:

- 8 or more winners at the track
- Strike Rate of 35% or more
- A profit of 15 units or more to a 1 unit stake
- A profit of 1.25 units per runner to a 1 unit stake

The more ★'s, the higher the confidence factor associated with that trainer / track combination.

## BANGOR

### Commentary

A compact, almost round track, Bangor suits compact, speedy front runners. It's always been a difficult track for the winter TTS with very few trainers able to make a decent profit here. However, top trainer Alan King used to do well with a particular type of horse at the track during the Summer months but hasn't had many runners over the last couple of years. Hopefully he's got a couple of likely sorts ready to run this Season.

## CARTMEL

### Commentary

Cartmel is a picturesque course which is a sharp and narrow left handed oval. The difference from other courses is the home straight which unusually veers off and dissects the main oval. The main circuit measures just over one mile and one furlong and what is also unique to Cartmel is that the run-in (the distance from the last fence to the finish line) is known as the longest in the country at just over 4 furlongs. With very few meetings taking place at the track each year there's not too much data to work with but we're going to concentrate on the two top trainers at the track.

## FONTWELL

### Commentary

A real treat is in store for you the first time you visit Fontwell. It's quirky and intimate, and the figure of eight chase course really lets spectators get close to the action. It's also a great course from a betting perspective, with lots of positive trainer angles to exploit. Fontwell has proved one of TTS's favourite (and most profitable!) tracks over the years and we'll be hoping that this years trainer can maintain our love affair with the Sussex track.

## HEREFORD

### Commentary

A right-handed track, galloping in nature and with a circumference of a mile and a half. The circuit is almost square, making for some pretty sharp bends, particularly on the home turn. With this in mind it can pay to follow nippy front runners with the ability to quicken, as they are often able to slip the field.

## HUNTINGDON

### Commentary

A right-handed oval course of about one and a half miles. It is very flat, and the run-in measures around 100 yards. A reasonably galloping track, with deceptively stiff steeplechase fences. They have only the one scheduled Summer jumps meeting this year and Nicky Henderson is our trainer for the track. There is no data for him for last Summer as he was serving a 6 month ban at the time.

## MARKET RASEN

### Commentary

Right handed oval jumps track of a mile and a quarter with a slightly undulating run in of 220 yards. A good test of jockeyship with some tricky fences particularly the last, it often favours front-runners and handy types. With 7 scheduled meetings set to take place this Summer it's one of the busier tracks and our trainer stats should be pretty reliable.

## NEWTON ABBOT

### Commentary

Newton Abbot in South Devon is a very tight left handed track with a circuit of a mile in circumference. The fences are easy and the course suits the handy type with front-runners hard to catch here. The going is usually firm during the Summer months but with the river flowing around the bottom end of the track there's always a ready supply of water to keep the track from becoming unraceable. Evan Williams likes to keep his string going all year round and he is our man to follow at the track through the Summer.

## PERTH

### Commentary

The Northernmost course in the UK, Perth is a right handed track with a level, sharp circuit of a mile and a quarter. The fences are relatively easy which suits front runners and handy types. Due to an excellent watering system, the going is rarely on the firm side. Nigel Twiston-Davies loves to send his horses up North to the course and rarely comes away empty handed. Peter Monteith's handicap chasers are definitely worth noting when running from either end of the weights i.e. 10-03 or less / 11-06 or more.

## PLUMPTON

### Commentary

Plumpton is a very sharp left handed circuit of a mile and a furlong, which is undulating with an uphill finish. The fences can be tricky and the ground can become very testing as the track lies on a clay surface. Gary Moore is the king of Plumpton and his hurdle runners are always worth noting.

## SEDGEFIELD

### Commentary

Most famous for being Tony Blair's former constituency, Sedgefield boasts an oval, undulating track of about a mile and a quarter in extent, with a run-in of 200 yards from the last obstacle. The tight turns, coupled with the many undulations, mean that it is a venue that is most suited to sharp-actioned handy types.

## SOUTHWELL

### Commentary

It's probably better known now for it's All Weather racing but Southwell does still stage quite a few turf meetings over the jumps including 3 meetings during the Summer months. It's a sharp left handed track which is pretty flat throughout and the jumps are considered fairly easy. Our two trainers have their fair share of winners at the track but the prices are usually quite short and making a profit is fairly difficult here.

## STRATFORD

### Commentary

A favourite course of mine, Stratford is a left-handed oval track of about a mile and a quarter that has sharp bends and a short home straight. It therefore favours handy, well-balanced horses. There is a run-in of 200 yards from the final obstacle to the finish. As the track stands on a clay surface it does not drain especially quickly, so the ground can become heavy during wet spells. With plenty of meetings throughout the Summer the stats look good for this track and I have high hopes for our chosen trainers.

## UTTOXETER

### Commentary

A left-handed, gently undulating, 10 furlongs oval with a run-in of 170 yards from the final obstacle. A track that is thought to favour front-runners, with easy bends. The fences here are not regarded as particularly severe. It used to be a good track for TTS Trainers but in recent seasons things have got considerably tougher and profits have been hard to come by. It will be interesting to see how jumping in the Summer months affect the stats.

## WORCESTER

### Commentary

Worcester is a left handed track of a mile and five furlongs which is roughly oval in shape. A galloping track with long straights and easy turns it has a run-in of approximately one furlong. This is a good course to introduce novice chasers as the fences are fairly easy and a lot of trainers bring their future stars here. In wet weather the ground can become very heavy and places a strong emphasis on stamina.
